2025 Reflections & Thanks

What an incredible year it has been for our community. As we look back on 2025, we are reminded of the power of coming together to support our hospital and strengthen local healthcare and programs for all. We are truly grateful for the generosity, time volunteered, trust, and shared commitment shown by residents, partners, visitors, and volunteers – proof that when our community unites, great things happen.

Although the *Here for You in the Highlands* Diagnostic Imaging Campaign concluded in 2024, its impact is being felt in meaningful ways. At the beginning of 2025, only six months after becoming operational, the new CT scanner is clearly saving lives—supporting faster diagnoses, improving emergency outcomes, and allowing EMS services to stay in Haliburton County more often, close to the people who need them most.

That momentum carried forward with the arrival of the Mammomat B Brilliant mammography system—delivered on a chilly February day and ushered, just barely, through our doors—bringing advanced breast imaging closer to home. New ultrasound equipment in both Diagnostic Imaging and the Emergency Department further expanded access to care, while construction is now underway to install new X-ray equipment. When complete in 2026, this final phase of the project will create additional emergency patient care spaces and a dedicated mental health room, offering a safer and more supportive environment for patients and care teams alike.

Beyond diagnostic imaging, your generosity continues to touch many areas of local healthcare. This past year, the Foundation funded essential equipment and critical programs supporting our most vulnerable residents, including Meals on Wheels, where demand has more than doubled in less than a year. Thanks to you, all approved projects have been funded, while we responsibly build reserves to meet future needs.

As you read this report, we hope you feel proud of the role you have played in strengthening healthcare across Haliburton County and we hope you continue to embark on this journey with us. Your support is making a difference every day—and together, we are building a healthier future for our community.

Thanks to your generosity, HHHS welcomed the new state-of-the-art mammography equipment in February, which was operational by early spring. Your donations made this life-saving technology possible, improving early detection and strengthening breast care close to home.



Minden Health Hub is bustling with activity including an internal medicine clinic and the new women's clinic led by the calming, and supportive, Gynecologist, Dr. Jennifer Mark. The women's clinic hosted its first and highly successful Pap-a-Palooza in the spring, a cervical screening clinic designed to make preventative care more accessible and convenient for our community. The women's clinic equipment is funded by the HHHSF and Minden Health Care Auxiliary. The next Pap-a-Palooza will be on Jan 27, 2026.



In the Spring, HHHSF funded the purchase of a much-needed GlideScope Video Laryngoscope for the HHHS Emergency Department (ED). This advanced equipment helps emergency teams secure a patient's airway quickly and safely during critical situations, supporting faster, more precise care when every second counts. Dr. Mario Lupo has taken over the practice of the recently retired Dr. Norm Bottum, ensuring continuity of care for patients. Dr. Carly Eisbrenner will be rostering 700 new patients while also supporting the Emergency and Inpatient departments at HHHS. Looking ahead, Dr. Max Rannie will join HHHS in April 2026, providing hospitalist care and shifts in the Emergency Department. Welcome!
